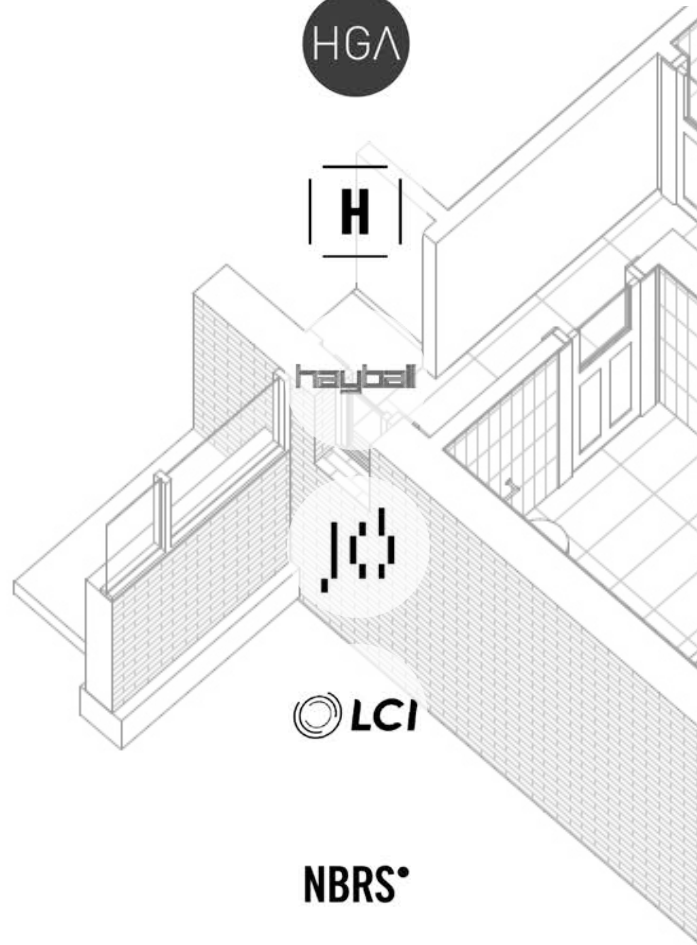


AWF INTO 2023

GOOD SAMARITAN INN

Women, Children & Young People's Crisis Centre

Design and documentation a new multi-purpose garden pavilion and Crisis Centre. Delivery and installation of the centre is anticipated in early 2023. (AWF with Hayball, LCI & WT Partnership)



LOCAL PROJECTS

WALHALLA, VIC

WALHALLA Community Asset Planning

AWF conducted an on-site multi day charrette workshop with members of the Walhalla Board of Management and community representatives to explore the potential for managed Crown assets to benefit the wider community. (AWF with Tract Consulting)

CARLTON NORTH LEARNING CENTRE — Indigenous Garden

The indigenous garden was officially opened in November 2022. The design is a peaceful gathering place where people from diverse backgrounds can learn about First Nations food, tools, and culture. (AWF with Tract Consulting, Gunditjmara designer Caitlin Harradine and the Wirundjeri Tribal Council)

INTERNATIONAL PROJECTS

CWRC Women's Resource Centre Stage 2, Fiji

The CWRC Great Hall Building was completed in 2020 and has become the base for community activities run by the Rural Women of Cakaudrove. A project to develop plans for Stage 2 of the Centre was presented to an Australian Government delegation in Fiji in July 2022. (AWF with Allen Jack + Cottier Architects)

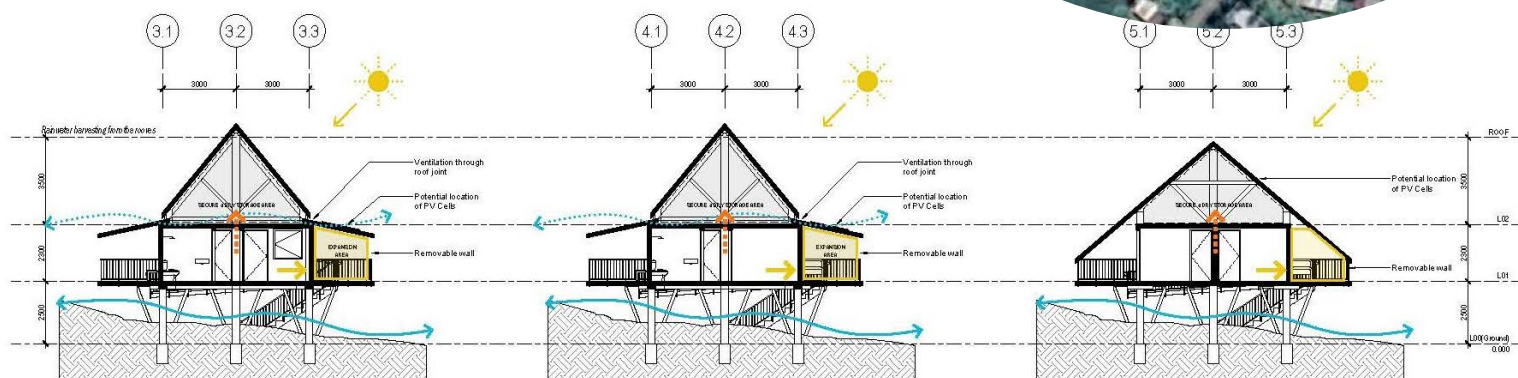


INTERNATIONAL PROJECTS



VUNIVAU Village Relocation, Fiji

Vunivau village can be inundated by up to two metres above the village ground and cut off from the road to Labasa during periods of heavy rain and high tide. We are working together with the people of Vunivau to formulate an urban design strategy and housing typologies for them and other Fijian villages forced to relocate due to rising flood and storm surge exacerbated by climate change. (AWF with Hassell)



INTERNATIONAL PROJECTS

BHUTAN School Kitchens and Stores

We are working with the Bhutanese Ministry of Education and the World Food Programme to make school kitchen and store designs more efficient, more hygienic, and more sustainable. The Bhutanese Ministry of Education's Health and Nutrition Division provides at least one meal per day to 60% of Bhutan's school children. Many of the existing kitchens and stores are rudimentary, cook with wood-burning stoves, and have unhygienic food preparation areas and insecure stores that lead to food waste and spoilage. INTERNATIONAL PROJECTS

ONE LIFE TO LOVE

Home of Hope Orphanage,
New Delhi, India

We are helping One Life to Love design facilities to house an orphanage for 10 boys, a Day Care program providing education, nutrition, healthcare & support for up to 50 street children, a girl's education program including library and computer lab, and facilities for physical therapy in a rented building. (AWF with NBR Architecture)



INTERNATIONAL PROJECTS



EJAAD Workshop and Learning Centre, Afghanistan

Construction work on Ejaad's Workshop and Learning Centre is almost complete. The centre combines spaces for craft workshops, literacy and technology classrooms, a rooftop terrace, a small kitchen, and a library. Ejaad is an embroidery and educational project fostering social change for Afghan women through craft. (AWF with Ejaad and SJB Architects)

INTERNATIONAL PROJECTS

KOMPIAM HOSPITAL Papua New Guinea

Development of a facility that provides critical health services in the remote north of Papua New Guinea's Enga Province, an area listed as one of the most disadvantaged in PNG. The hospital's Clinical Services Wing opened in June 2022, 15 years after AWF's first site visit.
